

## **Hall of Fame Award Criteria**

The Hall of Fame designation is ORBA's and the road building industry's highest honour. It recognizes consistent exemplary and distinguished service to the Association, the Ontario road building industry and/or the nominee's community over a long period of time. The award recognizes an industry leader who stands out from their peers for their dedication and contributions to the industry, their business success, their service to their communities and their leadership. Judging criteria is based on three general areas of involvement:

- 1] Support for the objectives of ORBA and other related industry associations and leadership in achieving them. Other contributions to the general enhancement of the road building industry not necessarily related to association involvement.
- 2] Success in business or professional career, including growth, development and innovation within their own company/organization as well as being recognized by their peers for their high ethical standards and business expertise.
- 3] Community involvement including charitable works, civic duty, involvement with local business organizations, sponsorships, etc.

Nominees do not have to be ORBA members or even necessarily road building contractors. However Nominees must have been active in the road building industry or in a related industry, occupation or profession where their work has/had direct and significant positive impact on the road building industry and/or the Association. (i.e. potential candidates might include government officials, consultants, association leaders, educators, researchers, politicians, etc.). Candidates may be retired, still active in their careers (or deceased).

Persons nominated in the past but not inducted into the Hall may not be re-nominated until three years following their previous nomination.

Voting for the Hall of Fame inductions is carried out by the ORBA Board of Directors, ORBA Past Presidents and current Hall of Fame members.
